Content Analysis

- First chapter of this chapter is providing understanding of political thought, nature of political thought, its significance, its textual approach, contextual approach and strategy of interpretation of different political thoughts.
- In second chapter, writer defines that what is classics and what is the significance or utility of classics. This chapter is in fact, divided into further three parts. First part is related to the Plato. General introduction of Plato, his theory of justice, his communism regarding property and wives is discussed in this part.
